- 1. The Clean-up Drive after Ganpati Visarjan at Juhu beach on September 10th 2022 was a huge success. Volunteers from all walks of life came together to clean up the beach and restore its natural beauty. The event was a shining example of how collective action can make a positive impact on the environment. The organizers were grateful for the overwhelming support and enthusiasm from the participants.
- 2. On World Heart Day, September 29th 2022, an awareness campaign on the effect of pollution on the heart was organized. Participants made handmade posters to illustrate the impact of pollution on cardiovascular health. The posters depicted the alarming statistics of heart disease and how pollution exacerbates the problem.
